

### 4.1.7 Quick Start

When the Job Helper mode is set to Quick Start (refer to *Section 4.1.3 - Guidance*), prompts for specific jobs that will be carried out, can be customized under System/Features/Quick Start.

There are several options that can be enabled or disabled. A green checkmark beside the option indicates that option is enabled, a red cross indicates that option is disabled.

1. **Export Job Report for Previous job** - will automatically export a job report for the previous job, to the inserted thumbdrive.
2. **Change Field** - will prompt to select or create a field, or will select the closest field to a current location.
3. **Record Boundary** - will prompt to record a boundary.

4. **Change Job** - will prompt to select or create a job with a Default, Custom or Entered name.
5. **Configure Job Regions** - will prompt to assign internal boundaries to work or exclude.
6. **Load VRC Map** - will prompt to automatically load a VRC map from the inserted thumbdrive.
7. **Set Guidance Mode** - can be set to whatever guideline type will be used.
8. **Change Guideline** - prompts the user to select or create guidelines with default, custom or entered names.
9. **Auto Hide on Success** - will hide the Quick Start window automatically once the job successfully started.

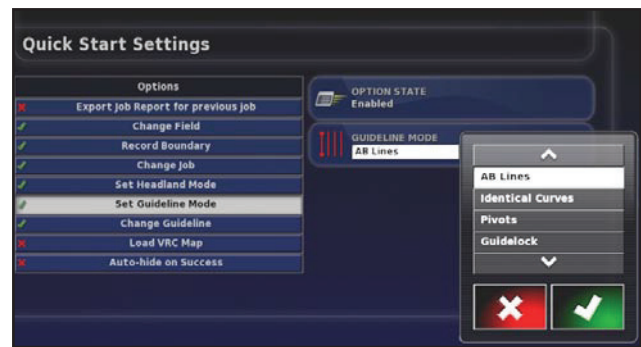


Figure 4.11 - Quick Start - Guideline Mode

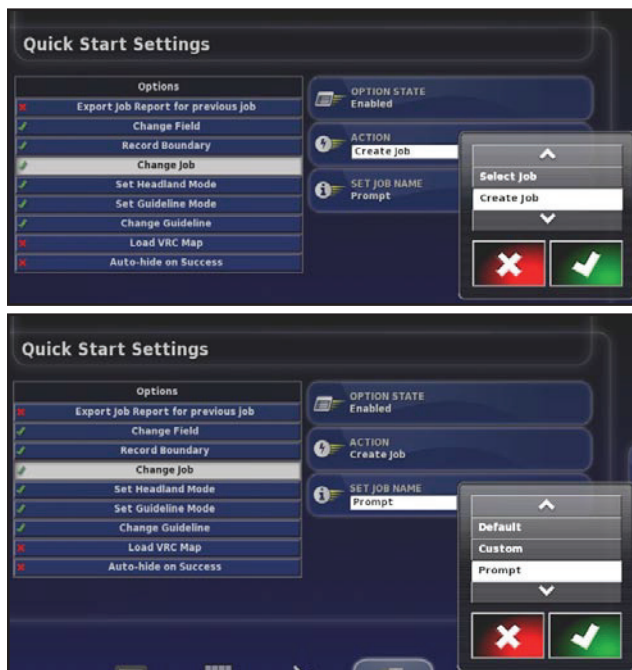


Figure 4.10 - Quick Start - Change Job

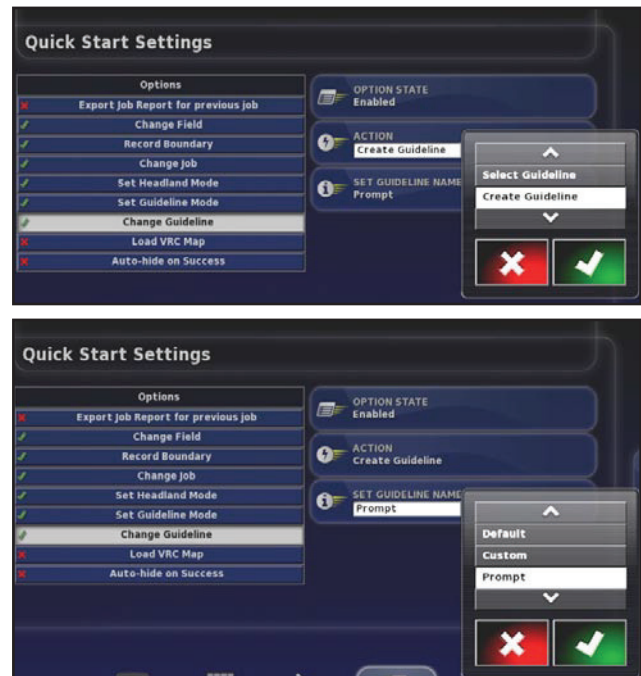


Figure 4.12 - Quick Start - Change Guideline

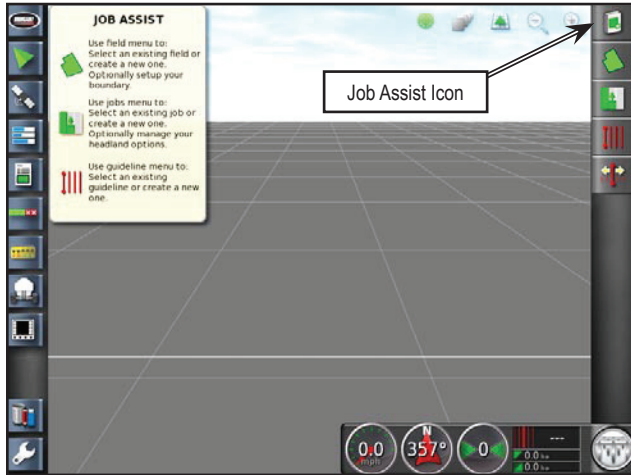


Figure 9.2 - Job Assist

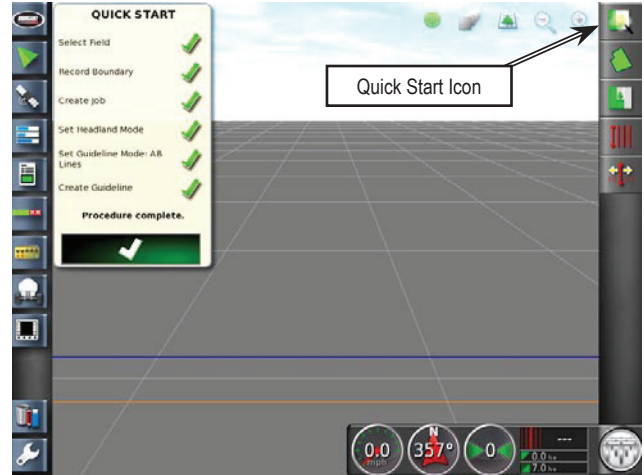


Figure 9.3 - Quick Start

- d. To open the Job Assist Window or Quick Start in the operational screen, select the icon for that feature from the menu on the right side of the screen, refer to *Figure 9.2* & *Figure 9.3*.

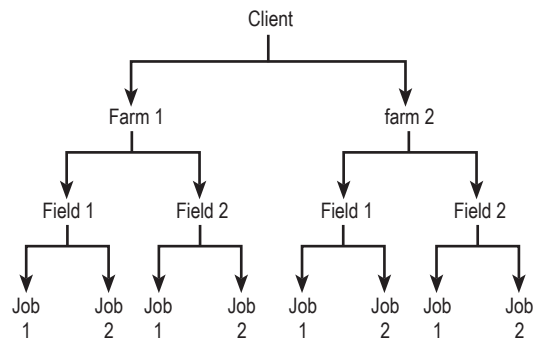


Figure 9.4 - Information Levels

- 4. The X35 console records and stores information about the client, farm, field and the jobs as shown in *Figure 9.4*.

- a. It is important to create clear names for farms, fields and jobs so that the information can be accessed easily next season.
- b. When creating a job name, there is no reason to include the field name, due to the file structure (jobs are stored under the fields).
- c. Multiple jobs can share the same name, provided that they are all stored under different field names.
